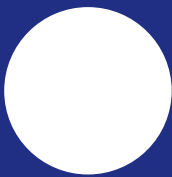

## Verify Plan Vote

**General Election**  
Sunday, November 2, 2025

Municipal elections in Montréal are held to elect:

- The Mayor of the City
- The Mayor of your borough
- City Councillors
- Borough Councillors

Municipal elections are held to elect the people who will represent you on the City Council and Borough Council until 2029.

## 1 Verify your registration

### Verify if you're properly registered to vote

Visit [elections.montreal.ca](https://elections.montreal.ca) or contact us to verify if you are properly registered to vote on **November 2**.

### Who can vote?

To vote, a person must be registered on the electoral list.

The following conditions must be met for registration:

1. Be at least 18 years old on November 2, 2025
2. Be a Canadian citizen
3. Have not been legally disqualified from voting
4. Meet **one of the following two conditions**:
  - Be domiciled in Montréal and have lived in Québec since at least May 2, 2025.
  - Since September 18, 2025, be the sole or co-owner of a building, or the sole or co-occupant of a business establishment located within Montréal city limits.

## 3 Get informed

### Positions available and candidates

### IMPORTANT DATES:

**Election Day:** Sunday, **November 2, 2025**, from **10 a.m. to 8 p.m.**

You can vote in advance:

- Sunday, **October 26, 2025**, from **12 p.m. to 8 p.m.**
- Vote at the Electoral Office in your borough:  
**October 24, 27, 28 and 29**

### Cégep and university students

Check the list of eligible institutions and the polling station schedule at [elections.montreal.ca](https://elections.montreal.ca) You can vote there on **October 24, 27, 28 and 29**.

### Voting for people with limited mobility

If you are unable to travel to vote due to **health reasons**, contact us to request **home voting**. You have until **October 16 at 6 p.m.** to make your request.

### Voting in Private Seniors' Residences

Polling stations will also be open in eligible private seniors' residences on Saturday, October 25.

### Elections matter to young people too!

At the Kids' Polling Station, children and teens can learn about voting by answering a question specially designed for them.

## 2 Register on the electoral list No later than October 16

### How to register if you're not already registered

#### IN PERSON

Go to a **Board of Revision** between October 11 and 16. Consult the list of all locations at [elections.montreal.ca](https://elections.montreal.ca)

#### ONLINE

Complete the online form and book an appointment on [elections.montreal.ca](https://elections.montreal.ca). A member of our team will contact you about the next steps.

At the time of your appointment, you must connect via **Microsoft Teams** and activate your camera and microphone.

If you are unable to move around for health reasons, visit [elections.montreal.ca](https://elections.montreal.ca) or contact us.

For any questions about how to register on the electoral list, contact us.

**After 6 p.m. on October 16, 2025, it will no longer be possible to register, and therefore, to vote.**

## 4 Vote

### Before going to the polling station

**Bring** your health insurance card, driver's licence, Certificate of Indian Status, Canadian Forces Identity Card or passport.

### At the polling station

From the age of 15

Several paid positions are available for the municipal election. To work in the election, you must have a Social Insurance Number and have access to a valid email address.
